#### COURSE SUMMARY

Each year in the United States, 14 million people become infected with the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV). According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, HPV causes 31,500 cases of cancer in men and women each year. Individuals between the ages of 9-26 can be vaccinated against HPV; but this preventative measure is being under utilized. Dental providers are encouraged to gather more knowledge about this phenomenon so that they can discuss the HPV vaccine with their patients and answer questions related to HPV and the HPV vaccine. These three presenters will cover the biology of the HPV, vaccination guidelines, HPV-related head and neck cancers, and the dental community's role in HPV cancer prevention. Guidelines for identifying malignancies in the oral cavity will also be discussed.

**Rachel N. Caskey**  
MD, MPP

Dr. Caskey is an Associate Professor of Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Medicine and Chief of the Division of Academic Internal Medicine at UIC. She is a health services researcher and her research focuses on investigating novel mechanisms to positively impact and incentivize preventive health behaviors which result in improved health outcomes. Her recent projects include employing principles of behavioral economics to improve adolescent HPV vaccination and studying alternate HPV vaccine delivery mechanisms to improve adolescent vaccination. She is recognized locally and nationally for her research. Dr. Caskey has an appointment at UIC's school of public health in the division of maternal child health where she teaches courses on health outcomes. She is a member of the UIC Cancer Center where she collaborates on efforts to reduce the incidence of cervical cancer.



**Kristen M. Stenson**

Dr. Stenson completed her residency in otolaryngology-head and neck surgery at University of Illinois, Chicago, and her fellowship in head and neck surgical oncology and microvascular reconstruction at the University of Michigan. She is an active member in the American Head and Neck Society and is a fellow of the American College of Surgeons and the Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. She serves on the editorial board of Head and Neck, and has more than 100 head and neck-related publications and book chapters. She has expertise in all aspects of head and neck surgical oncology for head and neck tumors, from those with early-stage cancer who require local reconstructions, to those with advanced tumors whose care entails multidisciplinary treatment. She has special interest in patients with recurrent tumors and those who have recurrences, complications after chemo radiation and complex wounds.

Dr. Lingen is a Professor of Pathology at the University of Chicago Medicine. He completed his dental school training, Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology residency and PhD in Cellular and Molecular Pathology at Northwestern University. Dr. Lingen is Director of the UC Oral Pathology Outreach Biopsy service and Director of the UC Head and Neck Pathology fellow training program. He is the Editor in Chief of the journal Oral Surgery, Oral Medicine, Oral Pathology Oral Radiology (Triple O). His research dealing with the molecular diagnostics and oral cancer prevention has resulted in more than 170 publications. Dr. Lingen is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology and is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, the International College of Dentists, and the Royal College of Pathologists.
